True Ferns (be careful of plants with "fern" in their name that are not true ferns, such as the asparagus fern. We recommend Google searching a specific fern if you are unsure.)

True Palms (be careful of plants with "palm" in their name that are not true palms, such as the sago palm. We recommend Google searching a specific palm if you are unsure.)

Houseplants that NOT are Safe for Kids & Pets

It is important that people know what plants they have in their household that could be potentially harmful if ingested by kids or pets. It is also important to know that many plants need to be consumed in large quantities to be harmful - what may NOT affect your 60 pound dog will certainly affect your 8 pounder. Poisonous plants often taste bitter or acrid and children or pets are not likely to ingest enough to be harmful, but it is always better to be on the safe side. If you suspect your child or pet has ingested a plant you are not sure about, call your family doctor or your veterinarian immediately.

The number for the National Poison Center is (800)222-1222. They can tell you if a plant is poisonous, but it is important to learn the identity of your plants in your home, because it is the first question you will be asked.
