Thank you for purchasing a plant from Alden Lane Nursery. We want you to be successful for years to come. Here are some tips to get you started and please feel free to call us with any questions.

Most Plants are ready to begin a regular feeding program about 4 weeks after planting. Just like people or pets, plants need food to grow, look their best. Plants also provide flowers or fruit for your enjoyment. The enclosed chart helps determine what type of fertilizer, how much to use and when to apply it.

Choose the right fertilizer for your new plant:

- Master Camellia Azalea & Gardenia Food
- Master Fruit Tree & Vine Food
- Master Citrus and Avocado Food
- Master Rose & Flower Food
- Master Bloom (Liquid or Dry)
- Master Formula 49
- Master Liquid Gold

Watering Reminders!

- Water new plants in the nursery container and water the freshly dug planting hole just before installation.
- Water daily in hot weather for the first few weeks after planting.
- Never feed a thirsty plant!
- Avoid fertilizing on hot days (over 85 degrees)!
- Water your plant thoroughly the day before feeding.
- When using a drip system be sure the emitter tubing is placed directly over the root ball of the new plant so water does not bypass the region of need.
- Also with drip systems, install at least two emitters per plant. One on either side in case one becomes plugged.
- As the plant grows expand the drip system to reflect the plants spreading root system.
- Check for moisture often & supplement watering by hand as needed the first season.
